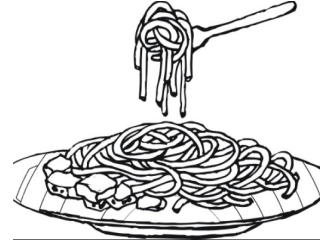

Mary's Month of May

"Why is May called the month of Mary?" asked Blessed John Henry Newman. With characteristic insight this great English convert answered eloquently: May is Mary's Month "because it is the time when the earth bursts forth into fresh foliage . . . For such gladness and joyousness of external nature is a fit attendant on our devotion to her who is the Mystical Rose and the House of Gold." In addition, said Cardinal Newman, May is the month that belongs distinctly to Eastertide and ushers in, most years, the great feasts of the Ascension, Pentecost, Trinity Sunday, and Corpus Christi: "It is fitting then that this month should be hers, in which we especially glory and rejoice in His great Providence to us, in our redemption and sanctification in God the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost."

But the association of May with Mary also has deep historical roots. Always a harbinger of new life, May for the ancient Greeks was dedicated to Artemis, the goddess of fecundity. In pagan Rome, May was the month of Flora, the goddess of blossoms. In medieval Christendom, this devotion was naturally transferred to the Blessed Virgin. Alfonso X, King of Castile (1221-1284) in his *Cantigas de Santa Maria* hymned Our Lady as the Queen of the May. With the growth of the liturgical calendar Our Blessed Mother found particular honor in May. When Ascension falls in May, as it nearly always does, the Saturday after the Ascension of Our Lord was traditionally celebrated as the Feast of Our Lady, Queen of the Apostles. The tradition of crowning statues of the Virgin and the Child Jesus with garlands of flowers derived from the ancient Eastern custom of crowning icons of the Theotokos and spread from Italy throughout the Catholic Church. In England, hawthorn blossoms were carried in procession to wayside shrines where images of the Virgin were adorned with flowers.

At the crowing of Our Lady on May 6, we will continue the venerable Catholic custom, and bring "flowers of the rarest," to the statue of Our Lady of Walsingham. There at her shrine we will sung the special Marian antiphon appointed for Paschaltide, the *Regina Coeli*. By order of Pope Benedict XIV in 1742, the *Regina Coeli* replaces the *Angelus* in the Easter season, and this beautiful prayer fittingly conjoins the mysteries of the Incarnation and the Resurrection in the singular joy of Our Blessed Mother:



O Queen of heaven, be joyful, alleluia.
Because he whom so meetly thou barest, alleluia.
Hath arisen, as he promised, alleluia.
