The Lesson: Jeremiah 20:7-9

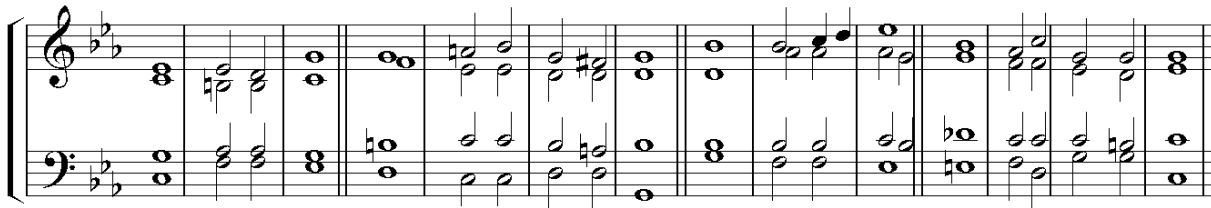
