The Lesson: *Wisdom 11:22-12:2*

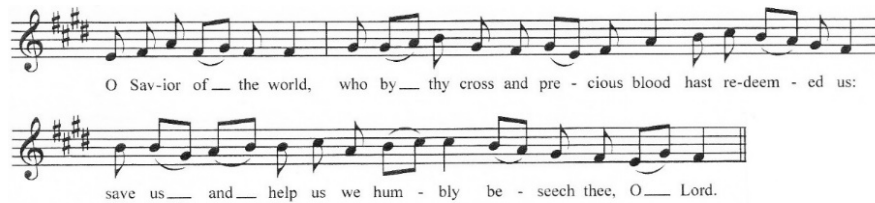

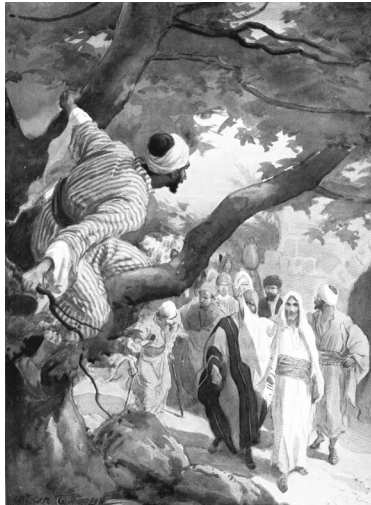
